

For those of you who are new to diplomacy games in Tinamou, my conventions are fairly simple. I use **bold** to denote the final position of a unit. If a move fails, it is

<u>underlined</u>. If a unit must retreat, then there will be no bold position and the unit's orders will be in *italics*. I normally combine seasons, fall retreat/winter adjustments/spring moves and summer retreats/fall moves. I will separate seasons whenever at least half of the remaining players request that I do so. I will try hard to send out a reminder to anyone who doesn't have orders in a week before deadlines, and where possible (i.e., if you have email) I will acknowledge receipt of orders. Press is encourage, abuse of the GM as well. Most of all, have fun.



- Bartertown buys 3 Titanium Factories (Or2, Or2, Wa6, Wa6, Ti9, Wa10, Ti11, Ti12, Mi15, Mi17) and three population factors (Wa7, Ti8) to man them.
- Diadem buys 3 Research Factories (MTi, Re 14, Re 14, Re 10, Or5, Or3) and three robots to man them (MWa).
- PlunderCorp opens the bidding on a Planetary Cruiser which he wins for 176 (NC22, NC20, NC20, Re15, Re15, Re13, Re13, Re13, Re11, Re11, Re9, Wa4, Wa4, Or4, Or2). He transfers a population factor from an ore factory to man it.
