Hopefully we are going to be getting back onto a more regular schedule now. Tax time and town meetings are done and we can get back to the important stuff.

March is the time that I participate in my annual reminder that true democracy is really being practiced somewhere. I live in a small town (under 5000 people). Our town business is still practiced the old fashion way, that is, we have town meetings. Day to day town business is overseen by three selectmen, elected for three year terms to unpaid positions. The schools are overseen by a five person board (I'm one of them), elected to three year unpaid positions. Every year at the town and school meetings, a budget is presented to the voters along with other warrant articles for any significant changes to the way the town or schools are run. Registered voters have the right to attend the meeting, speak, propose any amendments they want and vote on them. It takes all of 25 residents to put a proposal on the warrant, so citizen initiatives are easy and not uncommon. True democracy in action, a couple of hundred people gathered in the school gym debating do we need that new fire truck, should we buy the land behind the library to expand the parking lot, should we expand to a five person selectmen board? Everyone who wants to talks, then we raise our voting cards and make the decisions. I know that a modern nation can't be run as a true democracy, representation is necessary or nothing would ever be done, but I'm glad and proud that it still survives in some places and I get to participate in it. It's also a great civics lesson.

Continuing my existence in a little piece of Americana, we also attended a town contra-dance, geared especially towards the grade school children. It was a lot of fun, great to see kids as young as 4 out on the floor swapping partners with adults and having a blast. Then I took my 12 year old son up for his first practice with a local town band. The Temple Town Band is the oldest town band in the United States, established in 1799. Another fine small town tradition and it's great to see that the members span all the ages and that the tradition continues on.
