## Pioneers: Settlers of Catan (6 player expansion)

About Development cards. The rules state that a Development card can not be used on the turn it is purchased. The expansion rules allow the purchase of Development Cards during the Special Build Phase. This would potentially allow a player to purchase a card just prior to his turn and then use it immediately, which can be interpreted as flying in the face of the intentional delay built into the rules. I've done some searching on the web but not found a consensus. One group uses the middle ground that there have to be at least 2 player turns between purchase and use, so, for example, if Al purchased a card during the expansion phase of Brendan or David he could not use it in the following turn, but would have to wait an additional turn. If he purchased it during the expansion phase after Paraic's, Mike's or Brad's turn he could use it immediately. At the moment I'm not going to add any new rules, so you can not play a Development Card on the turn you bought it, but you can play it the next time you have a turn. I'd welcome anyone thoughts on the matter though (whether you're playing in the game or not!).
